Welcome, dear happy warriors to the Rabbi Daniel Lapin show, where as regular listeners to this podcast already know, this is the show where your rabbi reveals how the world really works. But even more importantly than that, this is the show that speaks about things that really matter to you. And even more important than that, this is the podcast on which we reveal that the more that things change, the more we need to depend upon those things that never change. And here, we are instantly at odds with the popular culture. Now, the popular culture I have to tell you, and has been largely adopted by the zeitgeist by the spirit of the times. And, and what's more, the popular culture more and more begins to resemble the newspaper of the Soviet state in the battle days, called Pravda, where the news organization, the news agency, or the news outlet is not so much reporting on the news, as it is telling the populace what they are supposed to think about things. And so for instance, at the time that I'm recording this particular show, one of the fairly noisy issues being argued about in the popular culture is whether boys can turn into girls and girls can turn into boys, whether men can become women or women can become men.

And so for instance, there is considerable interest in the fact that a current nominee for a vacant seat on the United States Supreme Court reported and responded to a Senate question by a woman. And the question was, can you define a woman? And she said, No, she's she's not a biologist, she cannot. And I find it hard to believe that a sentient human being cannot define women. I think the truth is that she decided not that she was frightened to try and define woman. And so that would be an example of where the popular culture is, is just plain wrong on so many things.

As far as Pravda is concerned, a one of the major American television networks, NBC, actually photoshopped a picture of this man who is swimming on a woman's swim team. That's right. And if you actually look at pictures that NBC ran three weeks ago, and pig with a picture that they ran currently, you'll see very clearly that her features were softened, she was given female complexion, it even looks as if she was given eyelashes. Wonderful what you can do with Photoshop these days, but this is pure

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prompter. This is NBC saying that if they can get enough men looking at their pictures that are hot woman that will help move the needle forward in the goal of the modernist agenda, namely to eliminate any real identification of male and female. And in previous shows, I've discussed why the left has such a deep and vested interest in eroding male female distinctions. That is something that we've spoken about. So somebody at NBC decided that photoshopping this man, swimmer, this male swimmer, to make him look more feminine, would help the cause. And so is this a news organization? No, of course not. It's as simple as that. Now I know what a number of you are going to feel or even say to me, if you write to me about today's show, you're going to say, Rabbi, Daniel Lapin, we've had enough of you, you are trying to move us back 200 years, listen to you talking. You're so out of step with current reality. You're so behind the times, you are trying to propel us backwards in time, 200 years. That's what you're trying to do. To a time when people had primitive understandings about sex and gender. And people had different understandings, marriage meant something completely different, right in the 1800s, and in the 1700s. And it does now. And so we tell you that you are no longer relevant because you are trying to move us back 200 years. To this, my dear happy warriors, I respond by saying you're 100% Wrong. That charge is incorrect. It's untrue. It's illegitimate, it's spurious. I absolutely and unconditionally deny that I am trying to move us back 200 years, what I'm trying to do is move us back 2000 years.

Now, this comes with its perils, obviously, because I am often administering remedies and solutions. And you know, one of the things I always say is that I teach ancient, ancient solutions for modern problems. That's what I like doing, I'm giving you ancient solutions for modern problems. And that works a whole lot better than modern solutions for ancient problems. By the way, there's only one problem with ancient solutions for modern problems. And that is that, for many of us, it is too late. I'm, and the evidence of this, by the way, is the most poignant category of letter that I receive. It is the most poignant type of comment that I will see on YouTube videos of lectures and teachings that I have given. It shows up with great frequency. And it always saddens me, but I totally understand the response. The comment the letter always says the same thing in different words, but the basic message is, where were you when I was making these wrong decisions 20 years ago, 30 years ago, what however many years ago, and I totally get that I understand it. And I know how painful that is. One of the most painful words, in the English language is regrets. And it's a word that is derived from the Hebrew. And it's a it's a word that has extensive usage in the Hebrew Scriptures, because it is so much a real part of living. And that is that we very often discover only much later. The mistakes we made much earlier, that in many ways, it's one of the enigmas of life. But it need not be fatal, because available to each and every

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one of us was information. But there were bad mistakes I made when I was young. And partially, I would have to say I knew better. And partially, I have to admit, that had I sought out counsel, I had access to many people who could have given me ancient solutions to modern problems. There were many people, but for so many of us, and so many of the people who write in saying Where were you when I needed to make these decisions that I made the wrong ones 20 years ago? And the answer is it's still worthwhile knowing first of all, sometimes on some level to a limited extent, it is actually possible to repair to put things right or At least to make a measure of improvement. Secondly, there are younger people to whom you have access, they are younger people over whom you may wield more influence than you realize. And it's hugely helpful for these people to hear from you, and understanding of the mistaken direction in which they are being sadly tagged. And for you to be able to provide at least some insight into how the world really works, you know, as painful as it is for for all of us, I often say that the overwhelming majority of today's financial problems are the result of bad choices we made yesterday. And it's absolutely impossible for an honest person not to agree with that.

And somebody wrote and said, Well, I, I don't agree with you, I think it's much more important to study the good book and to do good actions than it is to make money. And I said, Look, you know, you you probably are somebody who believe that food and water are much more important than oxygen. No,

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these are all things you need oxygen and food and water. We need these things to stay alive. And the notion that it's either or that you either are going to be a good Bible believing person who's going to focus on Bible study and on doing God's will. And what, remain poor, starving and to support your family unable to take care of yourself and your dependents, why, why are those things mutually exclusive? They're not, we're supposed to be doing all of that. And I explained that obviously, much more fully in the resources I mentioned, on the website, RabbiDanielLapin.com. Now, all of that pertains to the F of finances. Right? You know, that if there is one thing, to which I am solidly dedicated, and that is to make sure that anybody who wants to become a happy warrior, moves forward on growing his five F's, his finances, his faith, his friendships, his fitness, and his or her family. And so, so far today, I've been talking about finances. But we must also talk now about family because in exactly the same way that so many people, so many of us have made a Pauling mistakes yesterday, which have brought about financial stress today. So it is that so many happy warriors and so many other people as well have made bad mistakes about family yesterday, that have brought about unhappiness today. Now, I will just remind you, again, I like to think that they are regular listeners. And by the way, those of you who write to tell me where you're listening from, I really appreciate it. There have been so many wonderful letters lately, from so many different parts of the world. I really appreciate it. And it's very exciting, because at the time that I left, the ksfo, I left the radio station I was on in San Francisco. far? Because if you think about it, the way I like to put it is absolutely the only reason that you have cousins to get together with and to enjoy time with. And the only reason you have uncles and aunts to bring humor and eccentricity to the Thanksgiving meal. And the only reason you get birthday cards and birthday greetings from uncles and aunts and cousins. The only reason is because many years ago, Grandpa met grandma. And they took a deep liking to one another. And they began to live together. That's that's the result as a result of them being together. The result was one or two or more children they had and one of those became your parents and others became your uncles and your aunts. And so the family grew. But that happened because grandpa was attracted physically to grandma. And Grandma was physically attracted to grandpa, and both were willing and eager to do something about it and to consummate that attraction. And so, obviously, within the category F of family that of course we can talk about child raising and we can discuss relationships between parents and children in between siblings, and we can talk about so many different things. But don't forget, it also includes the frightening and sometimes disturbing topic of male and female relationships at their most basic level, and sadly,

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many of us have made mistakes in the F of family every bit as serious as the mistakes we made in the F of finances. So, in the podcast I did about why Jews are disproportionately successful with money. Some guy wrote, I think it was highly indignant, but and he said, I'm Jewish, and I'm poor, I struggled three, three jobs, and you completely wrong, Jews are no more successful than anybody else. So I wrote back and I said, look, oh, he said, he's got a degree, he's educated, and store his poor. So obviously, I'm wrong. So I wrote back and and said, Look, if you're serious, in this discussion, I will tell you that in 98.78 percentage, percent of cases of people suffering financial stress, it is strictly the result of bad choices they made earlier. And so you say you are educated, you have a degree, why don't you tell me what degree you've got, and I may be able to explain to you why you're poor. And he actually said, as he got a degree in journalism, okay. So it's as simple I did, he stopped before that to say, how many people out there are interested in the services of somebody with a degree in journalism, honest to goodness, if he would have spoken to me at the time, I would have said to him, you would do so much better going and getting yourself apprentice to a plumber. Because you'll make more money and you won't have student debt? And you know, you're learning something that people find useful? How do I know they find useful because they willing to pay you? And now with your Ivy League degree in journalism, you are discovering that? Well, nobody actually feels like paying you for anything you can do. And so yes, there's a very good reason you made a really, really bad choice. That's not hard to understand. It's hard to accept, it's very painful to accept every microscopic morsel of our bodies reject that notion, because regret is so painful to say, I have to look back and acknowledge I wasted my time and my money going to university and acquiring debt, and getting a degree in something only marginally more useful than a degree in middle period, Byzantine frescoes. Yeah, what do you expect, we have made mistakes. And the same way, we've made mistakes in the F of finance, we've made mistakes in their family, it's just that sometimes the F of finance is a little easier to see than the F of family. And I am going to actually give you an example now and I really did think long and hard about this, my dear happy warriors.

Because I, I recognize that there are going to be a number of listeners, for whom this is going to be painful. And I really went backwards and forwards, maybe I shouldn't do it. And then I thought, why is my job here, really to massage you with warm butter? Is my job really, to protect you from painful information? No, it is not. I am your rabbi. And that means that I have to impart truth that is ultimately helpful, even if not to you then to others in your orbit. And so I think enough of you all, to believe that you are capable of hearing painful information, not necessarily enjoying it, but hearing it right and sound exactly the same way that many people can hear. You know, you were really, really wrong, not to start serious savings. As soon as you started making some money. You were really wrong not to start serious investments when you started making money. And it's painful to hear that for somebody who hasn't done so. It's very painful. There's no question about it. But it is the truth. And knowing the truth is important. There is value in being enlightened. And there is certainly value in knowing something so deeply and with such pain. For passion, that you are more effective at communicating it to other people whom you could help. So all of this is by way of introduction to something that I've spoken of in different ways before, but in this case, we're going to start off with me reading to you, or I'm not gonna reach you, but I'll give you the gist of an article in a very well read woman's journal.

And here is the story. This was published in February 2022, February 27, to be precise. And here is the title of the piece. And you'll pardon me, it's a little bit vulgar. And it's certainly never my intention, at deliberately to be vulgar for its own sake. But here, I, I am sure that there is so much of importance that it is necessary for a happy warrior, men and women to understand that I'm going to tell you about this article, I'm going to I'm not telling you the magazine at the end. But I'll tell you the headline, if it's really, really important for you to get hold of it, you can Google it and get it. But I'm saving you the trouble of actually having to read the whole story. I'm giving you all the relevant information you need. Are you ready for the title? No, I mean, are you really ready for the title? Because it's unpleasant. Here is the title. The article is headlined, "How to hide a promiscuous past from your new man". And it goes on the subheading, is saying it saying, essentially, you're so into this new boyfriend, that you don't want to risk scaring him off. And here's what's so valuable to understand. Right here, before we go any further, what is so valuable to know and understand is that this acknowledges my ever present slogan, the more that things change, the more we need to depend on those things that never change. And one of the things that never changes, my friends, is the idea of and you'll I'm using, you'll pardon me, I'm using specific language here, exclusive ownership of a woman by a man. Now, what I mean by that is that no man who still possesses his Y chromosomes, would ever be willing to share his woman. That's just not something that is part of men. And what is more, that is always how it was. And that is always held will be, for as long as men walk the surface of this planet. I'm not trying to sound hyper dramatic here or anything. It's just, it's a basic reality. Now.

Is it true that men have been encouraged to try and tamp down that instinct in themselves? Sure. The popular culture is trying to de-masculinized men all the time. But an essential part of masculinity is exclusivity over your woman, it is also true that women desire to be possessed, and owned, if you like, by a man. And that is why it is that it is quite common for a woman to say to her male lover, Make me yours, or I want to be yours or take me. But it would be extremely unusual for a man to passionately declare, take me Make me yours. I think that this is just not how it goes. The The reality is that part of femininity is being possessed. And part of masculinity is exclusive ownership if you like, and, and that's what the wedding ring has always symbolized. And that's really basically what people always understood. Now, we'd have to go back in history, a little bit to the 1960s. And you'll remember in 1963, the Camelot couple, the dream President John F. Kennedy and his wife, the B wing Choosing Jacqueline Kennedy. In 1968, she married Mr. Aristotle Onassis, the Greek shipping magnate. And people in America, many people in America were terribly torn by that on the one hand, they felt they wanted this woman to to find happiness and to be able to continue her life. This is, after all, you know, five years after her husband was brutally assassinated. And so, but at the same time, at the same time, and you weren't, you need only look at some of the women's magazines of the period, which are so interesting to see how many people, not just women, many people were uncomfortable with their queen, if you like, with the wife of their great President Kennedy, essentially now belonging to another man. And so I should mention that, from a biblical perspective, one of the rules and it's it's a tough rule, there's no question about it. And, you know, it basically means that with privilege comes responsibility.

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But you won't be surprised to hear that the widow of a king of Israel is not allowed to remarry. And she doesn't marry anybody after that. And there is a reason for that. And I want you to think for a moment about the timeframe here. I'm now talking about what happens about the, with the wife of a great man marrying another man later than the time she was married to the man we're talking about. But then we'll also talk about what about being married to somebody earlier. Okay, let me try and explain that. But first, I have to tell you something that will shock you. But that in itself, does not constitute a reason for me to refrain from sharing this with you.

And again, I don't know of any easy, gentle way of telling you this. And so I just have to tell it to you straight. And that is that in reality, now, this is now what you're going to hear in popular culture. But and as always, I don't ask you to just take on faith, what I'm telling you don't do that. Think about it, listen to it, measure it, in the context of your own life experiences, of the things you've read, and the people you've met. And then little by little, it will become apparent to you that I am telling you a fundamental truth. And that would be a nice time to write me a letter and say, I didn't really think this was true when I first heard you say it. But as time has gone, well, okay, yeah, it's always nice, because I usually just hear from people who object to things I've said. But every now and then somebody special actually takes the trouble to write back and say, you know, years ago, I heard you say this, I really didn't like it, it offended me, etc, etc. But I've come to see that it's absolutely true. Well, it'll be like that with this little factoid as well. And that is that a physical relationship between a man and a woman constitutes marriage? There you go. It's as simple as that. Not legally, right? At the moment in current times, if a man has a relationship with a woman, it doesn't mean that the law says, Okay, you're married, however, you will remember something called common law marriage. What was common law marriage, common law marriage said that if a man and a woman live together as if they are married, then they are treated as if they are married. What it's talking about is this basic reality what is living together as if they're married doesn't mean roommates. It means there is a biological relationship between them. And that constitutes a marriage. And so the implications of this are really important, you know, people, people say, oh, you know, you'll never forget your first relationship. And they don't mean friendship. They're talking about a real physical relationship. Well, if that is true, and people say it is, then that would also suggest that there is huge importance, much more importance to a physical relationship than people today. In the culture, are willing to accept, why aren't they willing to accept because it makes something very important that they want to make trivial. And understandably, right, if you want to enjoy a promiscuous lifestyle, then you want women to be indoctrinated to believe that there is nothing of any significance going on. It's just a spasm in the spinal column, it's just the equivalent of a handshake, then that's what you definitely want to try and get people to believe I understand that. But I'm telling you the reality. And the reality is that it is profoundly significant. Now, many men who are honest about this either to themselves, which is most important or even to others with whom they're talking, men who are honest, will acknowledge that they would rather marry somebody who's never been married than to marry a divorcee. And men, if they're being honest, will also acknowledge that if they have no choice, but they're going to have to marry one of these two women, one is the divorcee, and one is a widow. In all other respects, the women are identical. This is a thought experiment, right? And in thought experiments, you can stipulate all kinds of things. In this case, we stipulate to identical

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women in every respect, except one is a divorcee, and one is a widow. Most honest men will acknowledge that they would rather marry the widow than the divorcee. Why do you think that is?

It's very simple. It's not disconnected from why it is that the widow of a king of Israel didn't remarry. Because there's something awkward about sharing your wife with somebody else, to say the least. Well, you could say, well, wait a second, it's not the king of Israel, his wife anymore his dead? Well, that is true. But that reflects an over simplistic understanding of time. And it also overlooks the fact that although the king has passed on, nonetheless, to his subjects, there is a part of him that still very much alive, especially if he was a good and noble and courageous king, then he remains alive to his subjects. And the notion that there is now another man living with his wife. That's a legitimately disturbing thing. And that would be one of the reasons that a widow of a king of Israel did not remarry. Now, let's imagine that for one reason or another, let's say the king was alive. And now another man lived with his wife. Right? That would be intolerable, unthinkable. In many cultures, that man would be executed. Why? Because it is not acceptable, right for a man to share his wife with another man, and certainly not a king. Because that throws tremendous doubts. onto what sort of man is he? So if we develop a slightly more sophisticated understanding of time, then we can talk about what is it like for a man let's call him Tom, whose wife lives with another man before, during and after his marriage, Tom's marriage to her, you got it. And so, you know, time is the variable here. But there are realities that transcend the time. And So how's about Tom dies? And now the question is, can What about his widow remarrying? And the answer is no problem. Because Tom is not a king Tom is just a regular guy. It's not as if the eyes of the nation are on him. Just as by the way, the eyes of America were on Jacqueline Kennedy, who became Jacqueline Onassis late in 1968. The eyes of the world where upon her and did that sort of lower the feeling that people had about her late husband present. Yeah, obviously on some level, on some deep level, yes, it does have an effect. So going back to Tom, in the case of Tom, if another man lives with his wife off to Tom has moved on. Is is is dead. Okay, that's okay. How's about Now if somebody lives with Tom's wife while Tom is alive, that's unthinkable. That's appalling. That's the worst. Now let's move a little earlier. What about if somebody lives with Tom's wife before, Tom marries her and she becomes his wife. Now, the popular culture view of that is, Hey, so what, who cares about it, nobody's business, it doesn't matter. It's irrelevant.

But what I want to show you is that even people on the left, even those who are trying to remake the culture, and they know that if they really want to make remake the culture, they have to remake it in all the five F's, they've got to change what people think about faith. They've certainly got to change what people think about finance, they've got to change what people think about family. And they've got to change what people think about friendships and not an accident, that in the old Soviet Union, while Pravda was giving you the news, it's no surprise that under a Marxist worldview, marriage and family are utterly devalued. Friendships are turned into things of suspicion. And, and you worry that every friend has become an informer. And certainly finance, nobody should have private and independent finance. It's all got to come from the state, and so on and so forth. We all understand that. And so we are talking about some very fundamental truths. So after Tom dies, another man lives with the lady who

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was his wife, no problem. During Tom's marriage to the lady, she absolutely would be terrible if she lives with another man who would be a betrayal of the worst sort. Hows about if she lives with another man, before she married Tom? And the popular culture says nothing? It's irrelevant, Tom wouldn't care. And if Tom is a modern enlightened man, he should not care. And I, your Rabbi say, Oh, yes, he does. Men are frightened to say the truth. And that is that most men would rather marry a virgin they would rather marry what in Hebrew is known as a bit Tula, somebody who has never known a man. That's what most men, but today, they'd be frightened of saying that. Now you might say, well, you know, who are you to make such a proclamation? Well, me, I'm just nobody, I'm just quoting from a magazine of the left specially created for women. That's, and so if I can't quote from there, where can I quote? Well, who says it's a magazine of the left? Well, interestingly enough, this article has been available online since February the 27th. But recently, just in the last few weeks, it has acquired a little preamble just before the article begins, in in bold, type in parenthesis, the following words, and by the way, when I first read this, I thought it was a joke. I really thought it was satire, until I verified that it's absolutely true. They mean it seriously. We recently received a credible report, alleging that one of our writers carries significant amounts of Russian ancestry by way of her grandfather. After a thorough internal investigation, we determined to fire the writer and delete her articles, we consider the matter closed. Can you believe that? Part of the left's desire to classify people not according to the content of their character, not according to their own individual actions and achievements and sins, but to classify people by their connections to groups? Are you a woman? Well, no, I'm, I'm actually the wife of a great guy and the mother of some other great people. And I'm not the My identity is not a no, you can't do that. If you are a good leftist. You've got to have loyalty to your group your class. And so it is this poor woman writer, has Russian ancestry.

Probably been she's Jewish and her grandparents immigrated here from Russia to escape Russian pogroms. That's my guess what happened? And the this magazine so if you had any doubts that we're talking about a left leaning magazine, this really does remove it completely. And so the magazine article, as I told you reads, how to hide a promiscuous past from your new man. In other words, this woman has been sleeping around. She's been behaving abominably. Now she's got a guy who she He is very eager to maintain a relationship with and to quote, the byline, the subhead of the article, you can't risk scaring him off, here's what you got to do. Well, if they really believed in their own lies, there would never be an article like this. They would say, hey, the guy's got to just get over it. You know what it is? There's no reason for him to have any concern about what you did or didn't do before you met him? And the answer is, they don't believe their own lies. They understand that deep down, men really, really, really do care about your past life, ladies, they really, really do. And that for that reason, I, whenever I speak to young women, I said, who I speak to groups in which they are young women. I said, please be aware of this. The quality of your marriage will be very different. If you enter that marriage that marriage, I'll use an old fashioned language in a state of purity, very different from the quality of that marriage. If you don't, does that mean you can't build a good marriage? No, of course, that doesn't mean that. I'm just saying it's harder. And that the the quality, when there has been purity, and this has this marriage is the first male female relationship you had, you will gain the advantages, the benefit from what you might see as your earlier sacrifices, but in reality, many times it's really your

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earlier heartbreaks is really what we're talking about. So you want to know about the rest of that article? Well, you could probably write it yourself. I mean, basically, she says, the author says, Well, you must lie and conceal your number, your count from your new boyfriend. And number two, you should try and find out how many people he lived with before you. And that way you can sort of throw it back at him. Right? This sounds like a really good way to start a relationship, doesn't it? But this is what secular fundamentalism promises you. And I'll give you a few things from the Oregonian listen to this. She says, first of all, let's make one thing perfectly clear. There is absolutely nothing wrong with being a slut. Does anybody actually believe that? They certainly don't. They don't believe their own lie. And then she says, in in this year of 2022, people should be free to experience sex, no matter their color or creed. And so you see that this is pure, contemporary indoctrination, who's talking about color and creed? What on earth does that have to do with a topic? The answer is that right now, in early 2022, nothing is not connected to color and creed. But that really has nothing to do with the topic of the of the article. And so there it is, I mean, the advice that I'm reading literally from the article now, her advice is to lie, period. It's that simple. It's a lie. There it is. Look,

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there's there's a lot of things to discuss about this very, very difficult topic, a lot of things to discuss. And I have discussed some of them in the past, and I will again in the future. But for now, you just need to know that. Yes. We have made mistakes in the past, whether it's with finances, or with what I call family. Yes. And it doesn't mean that there is no hope. There is always hope. It's crucial to understand that. Does it mean one can obliterate the past? Of course not. You can never obliterate the past. You can cover it over. You can try and minimize its impact on the present. But the past is there, and we all have memories. Now, we sometimes also have self defense mechanisms that tend to suppress certain memories that are painful, and that that is a great blessing from our Creator, who makes it possible for that to happen, right? But one has to at the same time, recognize this reality and it impacts so Many people today, because since 1960s, since the early 1960s, the left secular fundamentalism has been so successful in changing the culture and indoctrinating people and modifying people. And the university system has been so destructive to the lives of young people, particularly in this area that we're discussing and talking about that, it is very hard to find one's way back to sanity. And in something that, undoubtedly will upset many single women listeners, I, I will tell you candidly, that when young men consult with me as they frequently do, and the question is, and here we get a little hypothetical, we move into the realm of the thought experiment. But the the question is, I've got the choice of two different women, they are both identical in all respects, except one has, if you like, a history, and one of them is pure. Who should I choose? There's no question at all. It's so obvious, the answer is without question. And it's what I would would tell guys now, in real life, it's never quite like that. It's never quite as simple choice between two identical marriage partners who only differ in this one respect. But it does mean that, that if I'm going to be of any help to this man, we really have to delve into this, we have to talk about how well he will be able to deal with the history of his wife, if you're like, that is just a reality. And it's a real thing. So clearly, there are many women listening to this, who are going to be agitated and unhappy with what I'm saying. Because their instinct, and also the way they have been conditioned and indoctrinated to think, is that it doesn't make any difference. The fact that you had a relationship with somebody, it's gone, it's history, it's past, it's never past, it is always going to be a part of you.

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There is no getting away from that. And so think about that. And you will probably come to see on your own, as painful as it might be, that that this is true. And that the reality is, you are bound forever. I'm talking to the lady now, to the guy you had a relationship with, well, she's gone on away, he's got on his way, what

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are you talking about bound forever, that memory is still with you. And what's more, the imagination of it will be in the brain and heart of your husband, and nothing will be able to get it out. Not all the time, not always exactly the same. But when I say that when a man and a woman lived together, they are married. It's now not legally, they can walk away and never see each other again. But they can never quite eliminate the reality of that time they spent together even if it was one night. So powerful is this male female relationship that our Creator built into us. So immensely powerful, and so immensely unforgettable. And I'm so substantive and impactful and influential on everything else that happens in our lives, every attempt we make to diminish it, and to dispel it, and to suggest Oh, it's nothing I don't even remember it doesn't work. It's not at all how the world really works. Now, I really hope I have not upset you deeply and irremediably Oh, that you are able to get over it. I do hope that but if I have, well, then I may as well carry on, I can hardly make it any worse. And if I haven't, well, then you were able to take that permanent principle I told you, namely that a male female relationship constitutes a marriage. Not legally, obviously. But nonetheless, in terms of a reality. It's not a nothing. It's not insignificant. It's not just a social thing. Now, it's immensely powerful. And so you just got to be aware of that. Here's something else we're Being aware, remember, we were talking about that no man who's got a Y chromosome left in his body is capable of sharing his woman with another man. Well, now I'm going to tell you something else. And again, what I'm about to tell you now, it's something I'll come back to because it's a it's a huge topic. It's very, very difficult. I am not without sympathy. Because the reality of the world we've constructed the power we've given to government, the voracious appetite we've given to government, the huge number of regulations and the huge number of laws and the huge levels of taxation that have hobbled the economy, making it almost impossible, certainly making it very challenging for a family to live on one income. I recognize all this and I mourn it. I weep it copiously. Because it's such a tragedy. And what am I talking about? I'm talking about the fact that working wives have a really, really tough time on many levels, they really do. And one level on which the fact that a wife in a marriage is working, adds to the stress in our be talking about stress in finances. But when there's also such a thing as a stress in family, we've been talking about some of that up till now. And you know, sometimes it's, it's sometimes not even known, I have counseled in marriages, where it has never come to the surface, that the thing that is really stressing the marriage is the husband's unhappiness at his wife's prior relationships. And, and this is one of the reasons that in a recent ask the rabbi, Mrs. Lapin and I dealt with this question How dangerous and wrong it is, for married men or women, husbands or wives to go back and re meet people of the opposite sex from many years earlier. Because there are enough bad thoughts floating around your spouse's head. And now you want to go and hang out at the high school reunion with your former girlfriend from 12th grade or something or college or whatever it is. Now, this is not a good thing. It's not a good thing at all. And so we have to really understand that sometimes the things that make it hard in a marriage, things that stress a marriage are sometimes almost invisible at first, if you don't know what to look for. If you don't know

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about anything of these things we're talking about, then you're hardly likely to be aware that you are being stressed subconsciously on this. Now, I

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hope it doesn't apply to any happy warriors listening. But it is certainly common among marriages today, not just in the United States, but many places around the world. It is definitely a problem. Well, so what is the problem about working wives? Well, I'm not now going to go into the question of a working wife coming home. And at that point, husband wife have both been working all day in a huge stresses at that level on every level. Firstly, on the physical and the emotional, the, the the problems are enormous. And, and I've spoken about them, and I will come back to them, but only on one level now. And that is that if your wife, let's not make it you, if a wife has a male boss at work, this is not a comfortable situation for husband. Now, hubby may not even be aware of this, this may be so deeply under the surface that is not consciously even aware of it. But yes, is not a good thing. Remember, I said that no man wants to share his wife with another man or these no man with an Y chromosome left in his body, right? Well, you got to understand the reality is whether we like it or not. The reality is if your wife has a male boss, who from whom she takes orders, then you are already sharing your wife with another man. It's tough. And the reason it's so tough is because that is a it's already the situation which so many couples find themselves I get it. It's hugely problematic. I'm not saying that there's no way of working around it. I'm not saying that. There's no way a marriage can survive, obviously, right? Large numbers of couples are, you know, situations where both spouses work. In many situations, the wife does have a male boss. I'm simply asking you to be aware that the good Lord created us as male and female and they are so certain structures in ancient Jewish wisdom that do not prescribe how we ought to behave in the area of male female relationships, they describe the reality of male female relationships, and the consequences that those realities have in our day to day lives, where we try to build successful relationships. So a big kind to me happy warriors, I tackled difficult and painful topics today. Alright, give me credit for that. I didn't, I didn't evade them. I've told you about them. I certainly hope that nobody is upset or offended or bothered or troubled. It's things to think about, it's things to be aware of. If you are still young enough to make these things part of your plans going forward. While that's great, then I've really done your service. But for most of us, those days are past. And now it's simply a case of being able to build the best possible relationships we can in our lives right now. And sometimes having an insight into subconscious, often things under the surface that could be going on in the hearts and the souls and in the minds of ourselves and our spouses. Well, that's worth knowing as well. And so we move forward in our families, every aspect of that F just as we do with all the other five F's.
