Welcome, everybody to the Rabbi Daniel Lapin show where I, your rabbi reveal how the world really works. Thanks for being part of the show. And as always, I thank you for the diligent work you have been doing in promoting the show telling other people about it. You tell one person this week, and in a few weeks time, you will remember to tell somebody out little by little, our little community of like minded happy warriors grows and grows to the point where I think we really ought to start thinking of holding a real life get together one of these days, either in Florida or in Texas, or anywhere where the authoritarian powers are a little more reasonable. That's as far as United States based happy warriors go, we really ought to do that. And naturally, we should actually take a look at the map. You know, whenever somebody writes to me, and tells me where they listen to the show from where they're located, a pin goes into the world map. And from the concentration of the pins, we can tell where we have large numbers of listeners. And, and so yes, we've got large numbers of listeners in Canada and the United States, Australia, we have very large numbers of listeners on the continent of Africa. We have large numbers of listeners in India, and and then in a few other places, but those are where they've sort of heavy, large concentrations. So how about a happy warriors get together in Ghana, or South Africa? Or how about a happy warriors get together in Bangladesh in in Bangalore province in India, these are fantasy ideas that swirl around my mind, when I get up in the morning, but probably easiest to do initially in the United States. Our numbers are such that we probably could enjoy get together. I'm recording this show, although as you know, I seldom tell you when I'm doing the show, because as much as possible. I like the shows to be a useful to you today, tomorrow or next year. It doesn't matter. That's why we're not talking a lot about contemporary politics. But for the most part about the things that never change, because as I always tell you, the more that things change, the more we need to depend on those things that never change, and the principles that guide how the world really works. And those are not principles that change in any way whatsoever.

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But at any rate, I am recording it a week before Christmas at the end of 2021. And that means that is already time for me to wish my listeners a very joyous and uplifting Christmas. I think it's really

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important to acknowledge Christmas as a reality, particularly in the United States, because part of the challenge of secular fundamentalism has been that the devotees and advocates and guerrillas of secular fundamentalism, do everything they can to obliterate all expressions of particularly Christian faith, but all Judeo Christian faith from the public square and the reason they do that is because they recognize all secularists recognize that the Bible and Judeo Christian faith lies at the foundation of Western civilization, and their hatred for the achievements of Western civilization are such that as Karl Marx laid out very clearly at the beginning of his books, the you can't rebuild something if you don't first destroy what's there. And so obviously, the the destruction of the artifacts of Western culture precede the goal of rebuilding a socialist paradise. And what lies at the heart of what provides the fuel that propels Western civilization is, of course, Judeo Christian thinking and biblical values. You know, whenever I say that, I know that there is some Kraton somewhere who says, Oh, I suppose he thinks that fathers selling their daughters into slavery as a good Judeo Christian value, or executing idolaters Oh, yeah, let's go back to a Judeo-- Alright, look

Today isn't the day I've covered it on previous shows why that is so incredibly stupid, that people who said are really exceeding one another's ability in parading their own moronic thinking, for all the world to see. And that, obviously, is not the core of what Judeo Christian biblical values are. But I'll give you some clues to that very shortly. But for now, I cannot help being entertained by a recent issue from science magazine. So when I say recently, a little while ago, I don't I don't have the exact date in front of me. But, you know, certainly, obviously, it's covered, the article is COVID. related. So it's recent. And the article queries, something very strange. And that is that the COVID dam-panic, I mean, I mean, pandemic, the COVID pandemic seems to have a very low death rate in Africa, there's a lot of in fact, a lot of people catch it. But the the death rate, I think, is lower than anywhere else in the world, Sub Saharan Africa, almost, it's negligible. Statistically, it's not even on the chart. So why is it that the death rate in sophisticated countries like Canada, United States, United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand, where they've gone or out on the vaccinations, the death rate is far higher than in Zimbabwe and South Africa. And Kenya, and many, many other countries in southern Africa, that do not have the same death rate. Okay, now, I, I'm guessing that regular listeners to the show already know the onset, you're laughing the same as I am. But what's what's really funny, is that science magazine is a little bit like, you know, it's like there's an elephant in the room, and everybody's looking around pretending not to see it. I'm sure you've been in meetings or family gatherings like that sometimes where, by sort of tacit consent, everyone in the room has agreed to pretend that the elephant isn't there that, you know, they've all agreed not to talk about a certain thing or not to bring up a certain topic. It happens all the time. Well, that's what's so hilarious about this article from Science Magazine. Clearly, clearly, it is determined not to bring up the obvious explanation for why death rates in southern Africa are so low. So in the number of death rates in Africa, the number of COVID deaths, even by the way, with an extremely broad minded interpretation of COVID death, in other words, people who fall off a cliff, in whose bodies at post mortem is found COVID infections are ruled to have died of COVID. You think I'm joking, but it's absolutely true that that is the rule. And, and they have their reasons for that, by the way, you know, well, that way we know exactly. We have a number. And yes, there are a few crazy exceptions, like the motorcycle accident victim who died of -- you know, of head injuries, but it was

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listed as a COVID death. But overall, it gives us an idea - Well, not really, but that's what they say. And so they are trying to find out I'm looking at a study from Malawi and Mozambique it's so interesting wherever whatever cut Kenya, whatever country you go, Nigeria, they they are so anyway, sounds magazines are saying, What could this be due to? And and they are struggling to come up with it? Well, maybe the reporting isn't accurate. You know, reporting is inaccurate in a lot of things. But if there's one thing the world is completely, insanely obsessive about its COVID statistics, I think it's reported accurately. And so yeah, I see he has more some reports from Guinea, Senegal, Benin, Ghana, Cameroon, Congo. It's amazing. Amazing. The COVID deaths are like, statistically not there. So and by the way, the vaccinations is lower than anywhere else?

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So they come up with all kinds of explanations, and I'm not gonna waste time on them on them now, but I, I certainly didn't find any of them persuasive. As I said, there's one huge big explanation sitting right there. And I totally understand why they don't talk about it. It's so funny. As much as anything can be funny when people are ill, and many people are dying. But it is funny. You know what it is? And I'm sure many of you already know the answer. What medication has been widely distributed in Africa for decades already, on an ongoing basis, so much so by the way, that when I traveled to Ghana, a little while ago, two or three years ago, I was dosed up with this medication before departure. And in when you arrive in Ghana, they even ask, they want to make sure hey, have you taken your tablets? This is throughout Sub Saharan Africa for years and years, decades already, the population, they pop these tablets like Americans pop, I was gonna say oxy codeine, but I better say aspirin. So what is it? It's very simple. There are anti malarial drugs called hydroxychloroquine. And ivermectin, and these are two of the drugs that Africa has been consuming on a regular basis. Africans all the time. Well, guess what, folks? It appears to keep COVID deaths away. That's what it does. And that's what President Trump actually said. And he was right. But of course, Mr. Fauci in the United States and the authorities in many other countries in Europe, in the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, are so completely committed to the vaccine discipline, that that is the only way they acknowledge and information on on on hydroxychloroquine and ivermectin is suppressed, very difficult to get patients in hospitals have had to sue in the United States, have had to go to court in order to allow their own family doctor to administer these drugs. which Oh, my goodness, do you need any more proof than the entire continent of Africa? That hydroxychloroquine and ivermectin keep COVID deaths down? Well, it's, as I say, it's sadly humorous to watch the editors at Science Magazine, pretend that those words do not exist. And so that, that is what's going on there. Again, you know, as happy warriors, all I can say is that it is important that you keep your eyes open, and you keep your ears open, and, and that you try and analyze things with an understanding of how the world really works. You've already heard me tell you so many times, please, flee, flee, run, don't walk, run, for your intellectual freedom. And for your happy warrior. state of mind, when you hear "experts" quoted, run, like the wind, when you hear "studies reveal", run, like the wind. And so just use your own intelligence, the good Lord gave you understanding and knowledge, and it's there for you to use. And, and, you know, this is very often the simplest explanation is the place to start and may not always be the final explanation. But if there's an entire article in a science journal, probing, why are the deaths from COVID so low in Africa? Is it really being honest to utterly ignore the elephant in the room? is it truly being honest, for the word

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hydroxychloroquine and ivermectin, these two drugs, not to be mentioned once in the whole article. That means somebody is trying to avoid it. And, and why some of this insanity? I'm not going to go in depth into this today, Perhaps another time. But follow the money is generally a pretty good analytical technique for see who benefits from this. And, and the full details of the way that payments have been made, and are being made from the vaccine manufacturers, to politicians in the United States and in Israel, and in perhaps other countries as well, in which I'm a little less informed, but I have no doubt that is there. Follow the money. Yes.

And this is one of the reasons that they have now ruled that the full information, behind the scenes information, on the development and deployment of the vaccine for COVID vaccines has been locked for 50 years. And so not until late 2070s. In the like, in 50 years time, will the full information come out, including the money trail, how so many different organizations and politicians will be benefiting from the Niagra-like cascade of cash that has been flowing from government into private hands and then back into government through the vaccine wealth transfer going on? So please, remember, you heard it here first. There's no question about it there. There can be no simpler and more obvious explanation for why politicians in so many countries have vehemently hostile to the point of allowing people to die, rather than let them have ivermectin or hydroxychloroquine, where doses that'll save people's lives costs pennies, not not 10s of dollars, \$20 \$40 for the vaccine, and then a booster shot and another booster shot. And then we're told, well, there may be no into the boosters we may need. Yeah, I bet. Because every time a booster is taken, another \$25 is transferred from the public purse to the private. And from there, just remember, it goes back to those that make these decisions. And look at you might say, well, that's, you know, rather skeptical and inhospitable way of looking at things right.

But I don't promise to be friendly, compassionate, and or non skeptical on this show. I, I commit to telling you how the world really works. And when that way the world really works is sometimes a little falls a little short of what we'd like to see. We are happy warriors, we do not close our eyes. And last week's show was all about masculinity. Now, I think very often, women tend to be much more realistic than men. To the extent the generalization is true. Men can more easily fall into this trap of not being masculine enough, it's very easy. And part of what that means is, you know, not confronting the truth, wanting to avoid confrontation altogether. We covered that in last week's show. And I've I've had a very large response from listeners, mostly men listeners, speaking about how much last week has helped them. Many men have said, um, you know, I was shocked to realize you were describing me, I never thought of myself in that way. But, but yes, I'm afraid that I do find that I manifest all the symptoms you describe of lost masculinity. So that's what we were talking about then. And as far as this week is concerned, and every future week, for men listening, it is important to be able to face the truth, even when it is unpleasant. Even when every instinct in you is shrieking, to be left alone, and to pull the covers over your head and be allowed to crawl back into the cave and just ignore everything that's going on. A man doesn't do that. Because others depend upon him to be alert to approaching dangers. And whether those dangers are coming to threaten your family or your finances. Maybe they're coming to threaten your faith. Maybe they're coming to threaten your social environment, your friends, or

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maybe they're coming to impact your health or maybe all of the above. As secular fundamentalism tends to do. The the masculine man, the real happy warrior is prepared for it. The women happy warriors seem to be more innately able to see this and understand it and to cope with it. I wonder if it comes I'm just speculating idly here. But

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I wonder whether the process of childbirth profoundly changes a woman. I mean, childbirth changes a woman more than marriage does. And it's possible that one of the ways it changes women I'm speculating as I say at the moment, I haven't researched this or looked into it. But maybe one of the ways is that women who've given birth and brought life into the world are just more real and and more capable of facing reality. You know, when when you're expecting a baby, and you're two months pregnant is okay, in seven months time, I'm actually going to give birth that's called facing reality. Now, very often, their husbands are pulling the blankets over their heads. And they're not even, they're not even admitting, into their minds, the complexities and the details of that far off day, seven months down the road, where a screaming bundle of protoplasm is going to be put in their arms. And they are going to realize that in that instant, they've suddenly been magically transformed from merely a man into a father. That changes everything. But they don't always know that, do they? Now, as I said that last week, your rabbi, that would be me, I was speaking about masculinity. And so that would have been one of the five F's, the F of family, right? Because a man who is suffering from a, an attack on his masculinity, and his his backdrop, and I covered last week, some of the reasons and how that comes about that we men have this tendency, far more far more than women lose femininity, men can lose masculinity. And again, I have touched in the past on why that is. But and so again, if you're interested in confused about any of this, I strongly recommend going back to long ago episodes of The Rabbi Daniel Lapin show, wherever you listen to podcasts, and, and follow up on all of that, because I don't want to repeat things that we've covered extensively, because I know there are so many of you, that are meticulous about covering and learning from every single show that is released. And so suffice it to say that last week, there we were doing masculinity and obviously, a man who suffers who is not fully masculine. And by the way, it goes without saying that I wasn't talking only in terms of physical performance or anything like that. No, that is one of the symptoms of a generalized loss of masculinity. But I'm speaking about spiritual as much as physical I'm speaking about mental and, and psychological as much as biological loss of masculinity is manifested not only in certain parts of the home, but in overall ability of a man to function. As a husband, and as a father, even the ability to adequately and appropriately keep children disciplined and educated and growing. That in itself is masculine nurturing that not every man is comfortable doing. However, the good news is, it's eminently repairable. And that's what we spoke about last week. So last week was the F of family. This week, we go back to the F of finances. And the the fact is that, that out before the end of the I'll do a show on what I think we have looking ahead in 2022. But it's clear, obviously that if I were giving predictions for 2022, one of them would be the fact that prices are continuing to go up we have inflation, we have inflation, because inflation is the consequence of immorality in the ruling class. And again, something I have covered extensively in previous shows, please go back, where I explained why it is that an immoral government fails to coin new currency exclusively and only when wealth has been generated in the populace by people serving one another. And I know this is putting it not in terms that will be approved on by your

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local kindergarten where the economics professor teaching econ 101, won't tell you anything like this about inflation. And, and they truly believe that inflation will be solved by minute and delicate adjustments of the money supply or we just have to change the interest rate. And we just adjust this and we'll be able to keep inflation under control. Wrong. Not true. And there's another thing they found a sandwich. A low rate of inflation is good for everybody, you know 1% 2% In fact, that's no wrong. zero inflation is what is good. The only reason they say that when I say that I'm talking about usually good Government economists, the reason they say it is because they have proven virtually incapable of the moral prestige necessary. In order to keep inflation at a zero figure, it's not hard, you just have to not want to spend other people's money. That's all, you just got to be willing to not go into debt, you just got to be willing to not spend more than the population is giving you in taxes, that's all you got to do, and inflation will be zero, and everybody's better off. But right now, I'm sorry to say that in in countries where inflation is growing as rapidly as it is in the United States of America, if you have a way of borrowing money at a low interest rate, and the money can be used, not for consumer purposes, not for buying a new toy, but for business purposes to be employed, as business capital, go for it. I mean, don't hesitate. And surely a time of inflation is not a time to hold cash, you got to be very careful what you do with your cash because its value is being eroded significantly, perhaps one half to 1% a month. So that's very serious, right? Because if you've got \$1,000 in savings, and it's sitting in a savings account, that's paying you you know, point 3% interest, virtually, you know, negligible. And, well, it's very possible that 10 to \$15 of that is vanishing into thin air every single month. So what do you do? Well, one of the things that it's worthwhile bearing in mind is that this is a good time to start a business, it's also good time to purchase a business, by the way, again, being smart, getting good advice and good guidance from a good business broker. But rather than just sitting on cash, other than your emergency fund, right, everybody should have a few months at least have living expenses tucked away in an easily accessible place, somewhere where where you can get hold, as opposed to a certificate of deposit. That might be you know, months of waiting for you can get the money without major penalty. So but having a business is a good thing to have in inflation returns. And so what do you what do you do? How do you go about doing that? You might say, well, you know, I'm, you know, I'm not, I have no experience in business. Well, that's true, but maybe you have a lot of experience in tying fishing flies, you know, maybe you maybe you've got decades of experiences as a fly fisherman. Or maybe you cost your own bullets, maybe you're a hobbyist and you got a workshop in your basement where you make your you do reloads, right, which is I mean, with the rising cost of ammunition, and you do any shooting, being able to do whatever it is, if there are certain things that you are able to do that would be useful to other people, you really should think about turning it into a business well, how do you do that? You know, your you got a job you got to you got to keep utilities if you can just quit your job and rightly so no. How do you do it? Well, I want to introduce you to another little piece of ancient Jewish wisdom. I've spoken before extensively on why it is that Jews are disproportionately good with money. And in my book, thou shalt prosper, which continues to sell as well as it deserves, which is thank God very, very well indeed. The I explain how I D bunk, the four mythological explanations for why the people of Israel have always in every place in time being identified and recognized as being disproportionately good with money. And I've explained that it's none of those explanations, but the real explanation is a very significant accumulation of wisdom, Bible based wisdom that is deployed and I'm not talking about simple little slogans from the book of Proverbs, because unfortunately for every slogan that tells you

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one thing, there's another one that tells you something else, you know, there's there are verses that tell you how good it is to live on nothing but bread and water and be very frugal. And then there are other verses that that praise having wealth, they they seem to just counter each other out as slogans do in English, right? You have it all the time where somebody says to a soldier going on deployment and is worried about what his girlfriend will be up to in his absence and his maybe they should get married. He doesn't know what to do. And he's pal Pat's him on the shoulder and says, Don't worry, absence makes the heart grow fonder. You know, if you're away on the six month deployment When you come back, she'll love you even more. And then it's just about starting to feel more comfortable and more secure. When another buddy taps him on the shoulder and says, I see you leaving your girlfriend behind. Well, I guess out of sight out of mind. And he feels awful again. Yeah, simple slogans are not the way that wealth is created. It is a large, very large, comprehensive, and well integrated body of data, which is very difficult to take a good deal of specialized knowledge, to condense it down to the tips and the tools and the techniques that can be found in my book business see business secrets from the Bible, and that I talk about right here on the show. And one of them is I'm about to tell you what to do in the situation where, yes, you actually you think about it, hey, I actually do have a skill or an ability, I just don't know how to turn it into a business. Okay. Well, the key to this is Genesis chapter two, verse 18. And God said, It's not good for man to be alone.

And I do not believe that anybody should not have a Reference Bible in his possession. I can't understand I mean, a household that doesn't have a Bible. I mean, barbarians, honestly, it's literally barbaric. For a civilized human being, and not to possess a bonds ridiculous, I've never heard of such a thing. And so well, I have fortunately, but at any rate, I have a recommended Bible, on on the website if you don't have one yet. And there are a lot of reasons why this is a terrific Bible. But if you have it, on page seven, you will find the words and God said not good for man to be alone. Now, a lot of mistaken people assume that this just again, people who don't have a Bible that they can refer to think this means well, you know, Adam was supposed to get married, and God wants to create Eve, that is a specific, focused application of the principle, the general principle is far wider. And to just give you the essence of it, right now,

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it's very simply this, you need a partner. That's right, you need your immediate job now is to seek a partner, maybe it's somebody who's doing an accounting degree at the local community college, maybe, maybe it's, it can be anybody, but what you're looking for is somebody who is the mirror image of you, somebody who knows business, but can't think what what to provide. And you got to find that person, I promise you that somewhere in your orbit, you may not know that person yet. But he or she exists. And that person will be as grateful to find you as you will be to find them. And one of you becomes the person who makes the object that you you tie the fishing flies or whatever it is that it's going to be. And the other person understands how to find nursery capital, how to market, how to keep the books and keep everything legal and compliant. And the two of you together, have formed a business. So please, don't underestimate the significance of that verse, verse 18, on page seven of my

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Bible, where it says not good for man, to be alone, don't underestimate how powerfully significant that has been for Jews throughout history and in every place on earth. Because the secret of partnership is immensely powerful. I do a seminar very frequently for people and it's called partnership power. And that's exactly what this is all about. It's It's hugely valuable and very, very effective. So just realize that a whole new world of creativity can open up to you through collaboration. Not good for man to be alone. Yeah, that's why you can't get a business off the ground because you just don't know what the next step should be.

And you've got somebody that whom you haven't met yet, who's sitting there being tormented by exactly the same thoughts. I know how to get a business off the ground. I'd be so good at running a business. I just don't know what to do. I'm not good at anything else. But he needs you. And you need him. And hey, presto, a partnership is born. And creativity is the inevitable result. So one more tip on the F of finances, is the idea of starting off right away no matter how old you are, how young You are a really important part of the secret of success in business is always saying less than you do, or in other words, doing more than you promise that it's, it's very difficult. But it's also very important. Back to my Bible, page 509. And verse three says, this is the book of Numbers, chapter 30, verse three, listen to this. "If a man vow a vow to the Lord or swear an oath, that binds himself, he should not break his word. Like everything that came out of his mouth, he should do." This is really important. What this says is that, that you should regard speech as holy. And that every word that comes out of your mouth is important. It stands for something. And what's more, it binds you. And every time you relate meaningfully to what comes out of your mouth, you become a better happy warrior, you become a more effective human being a more powerful human being, man or woman. And, and that's what that verse teaches.

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And then everything is consistent with that in in a very beautiful way, you know, for instance, there is a well known story again, I'll give you a page number page 45. In Rabbi Daniel Lapin recommended Bible, page 45. You find the beautiful story in chapter 18, of genesis of the three angels coming to visit Abraham. Abraham is not feeling well. And the angels stop by Abraham doesn't know their angels. He assumes they're people. And he invites them in. So he likes people to come in. And by the way, this was part of how Abraham operated his ministry. He brought people to monotheism by inviting them into his house. And here's what he said, Come in, rest up, use my restroom, and sit down, and I'll go get some bread and, and get you something to drink. And you'll feel better. So what does he undertake to do? He's undertakes to give them some bread and water. And he knows you know, any passing traveler will be happy to have somewhere to sit and be able to use a restroom and be able to get some bread and water. But what does he actually do? He rushes to Sarah and he says, quickly, let's bake some fine bread. And then he goes and slaughters a, some beef and and he gets hold of butter and milk. And, and the meat that is prepared. These people expect to bread and water because that's what Abraham undertook what did they get a veritable feast I got. It was incredible. A real feast. You know, again, beautiful that is it really is beautiful.

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And then we've got the the great story of where Abraham servant Eliezer is sent to find a wife for Rebecca. And so Isaac's future wife, Rebecca says to the server and says to Eliezer she says, sure. She he asked for a drink, she takes the pitcher down from her shoulder, and gives him as much water as he wants to drink. And then when she done that, she says, I'm also going to get water for your camels until they've drunk their fill. Why didn't she said at the outset, why didn't she say hey, have a drink, and I'll water your - cuz she wanted to make sure she could deliver. So she first of all, offers him a drink. When that works out fine. She now says Okay, now I'll take care of the camels, always being careful to follow this rule of say less and deliver more. This is a crucial tool in the arsenal of business success that have been practiced by the people of Israel for centuries and centuries. And it's something that you can do too.

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So you can see that beautifully what we find is a consistency everywhere that every story I look at. And sure enough, the same principle of saying less and doing more is is brought to the fore. And also on the opposite. There was a guy called Ephron. And he said when Abraham was looking to buy a field to start a cemetery in which he could bury Sarah, page 61 In my recommended Bible at [www.rabbidaniellapin.com](http://www.rabbidaniellapin.com), how do you like to I slip that little commercial in there without you even noticing? And in Genesis chapter 23, he speaks To Ephron, about the fact he wants to field and Ephron says, Oh, I'll give you to please you, I didn't know you want to field with the greatest of pleasure. And he says, I give it to you, no problem, Abraham, you may have the field as a gift, verse 11, I give you the field and the cave that's in it, I give it to you, in the presence of my people go ahead and set up your cemetery. And Abraham says, I'd really like to buy it, you know, tell me the price. And he says, well, and this is in a sort of very passive aggressive kind of a way. He wants the money, but he doesn't want to say it after he said, You can have it for free. So he says, you know, what, you know, field that's worth 400 shekels of silver. You know, who cares? What's that mean? Well, that was a huge amount of money. And Abraham correctly interpreted that as Ephron basically telling him the price that he wanted. And so sure enough, Abraham paid 400 shekels of silver for the field, Ephron promised much, namely 100 as a gift, but gave little in the end. And so friends, please do think seriously.

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If you are in a position in any way whatsoever, where you should be thinking about a second stream of income, another revenue stream, maybe maybe it's a first revenue stream, maybe maybe you're in a bad position, you don't have a revenue stream yet. 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promise less than you deliver. And your reputation will spread so rapidly, you will have customers you will have clients, you will have the ability to really build your business. So with all of those, I really think that you have something valuable to move forward with. I want to wish you again, a joyous and uplifting Christmas. It is a lovely time of the year. And I hope that you are blessed to be able to spend it with very good friends and loving family.
